

P2C Group Roles with the 14 Career Clusters

How to Use: This resource is designed to help educators facilitate collaborative group work through the lens of the 14 Career Clusters. Each cluster is paired with four group roles: *Lead, Coordinator, Technician, and Advocate* – to ensure that every student has a meaningful responsibility while connecting their work to real-world career pathways.

- Educators can use the document to assign roles that build collaboration, communication, and accountability within group activities.
- Students can use the role descriptions to understand their responsibilities and practice skills aligned with specific career clusters.
- Career Connections: Each role is linked to real career examples, helping students see how classroom teamwork mirrors workplace collaboration.
- Flexibility: Roles may be rotated across activities, so all students experience different responsibilities and are exposed to a variety of career-related skills.

By using this document, classrooms can foster teamwork, strengthen employability skills, and build awareness of diverse career opportunities across the 14 clusters.



P2C Group Roles with the 14 Career Clusters

Role	Role Description			
Lead	Guides the group's discussion and presents the final solution. Asks questions to other groups when needed.			
Coordinator	Keeps notes, manages time, and ensures that everyone in the group follows the right steps.			
Technician	Encourages team members to use their resources and checks the accuracy of the group's answers.			
Advocate	Ensures all voices in the group are being heard and that everyone is using the conversation cards.
